Weekly Message from Fr George:

Do Not Worry; Jesus Has Overcome The World, Including Our Low Moments

Mark's gospel presents the Healing Jesus. Even though Luke is the physician and presents in his gospel the healing power of Jesus, Mark has some moving moments that show Jesus as not just one with power and authority, but one who identifies with our human condition and empathizes with us, and acts to give us holistic healing — body, and soul that obliterates all societal stigma. The author of the Hebrews puts it so when it says Jesus "had to become like his brothers and sisters in every way, that he might be a merciful and faithful high priest before God to expiate the sins of the people. Because he himself was tested through what he suffered, he can help those who are being tested." Heb 2:18)

We see Mark begins his gospel with these powerful incidents, thereby announcing the manner of the man Jesus is, clearly distinct and different from anyone before and after him, including the scribes, for he teaches with "authority and power" (cf. Mark 1:21ff). Jesus demonstrated this as he went on to deliver and clean the man with unclean spirit.

In The Healing of the Paralytic, we see faith in action and demonstrate that when Jesus heals, it is holistic; the entire person, spiritual and physical, is healed. In that incident, the friends of the paralytic man intended to bring him to Jesus, but when they came, the place was crowded, and there was no way in. They had to climb the roof, open it, and lower their sick friend to where Jesus was standing. What a faith! Jesus saw this and was moved, irrespective of the obvious opposition of the scribes and Pharisees. Jesus healed him spiritually by forgiving him of his sins and physically by othering him to pick up his mat and go home (Cf. Mark 2:1-12). In healing the man with leprosy, Jesus 'moved with pity' and said, "I do will. Be made clean" (Mk 1:40-45). In Mark 1:29ff, Jesus visited Peter's home and healed his mother-in-law and many others he cured from sickness and diseases.

There are so many people out there who are bedeviled by many illnesses. Most of these are not physical. Persons who are so depressed that they rely on different substances to live a normal life; some others are addicted to drugs and other substances; others are consumed by anger, unforgiveness, and hatred; some others are torn apart from their families, and so on. Indeed, some others are undergoing real medical issues; some are born with terrible medical conditions; some others are terminally ill; some are suffering from diseases with no known medical cure.

But here we are, serving a living and powerful God. This is the Jesus we must present to our brothers and sisters. The Jesus that Mark talks about, including his deeds, is the Jesus we need to present to our friends: the Jesus that has overcome the world (cf. John 16:33). Never hesitate to present him to friends and relations who are undergoing any form of medical challenge or emotional confusion. I know this, Jesus; I must talk to a friend, a sister, and a brother about him and his healing powers and authority.



Excerpt from, 'I Thirst' Prayer by Mother Teresa

"No matter how far you may wander, no matter how often you forget Me, no matter how many crosses you may bear in this life; there is one thing I want you to always remember, one thing that will never change. I THIRST FOR YOU-just as you are. You don't need to change to believe in My love, for it will be your belief in My love that will change you. You forget Me, and yet I am seeking you every moment of the day-standing at the door of your heart and knocking. Do you find this hard to believe? Then look at the cross, look at My Heart that was pierced for you. Have you not understood My cross? Then listen again to the words I spoke there-for they tell you clearly why I endured all this for you:

All your life I have been looking for your love—I have never stopped seeking to love you and be loved by you.
